Becky Robbins, a consultant for Comfort Tech, Custom Heating & Air Conditioning, will discuss the benefits of installing a geothermal system to provide heating, cooling and hot water for a home or business. She will explain how geothermal heat pumps work, how cost savings can be achieved, and how tax incentives can reduce the overall cost of geothermal technology.

“Upgrading a home’s heating and cooling system can make the biggest impact on a home’s energy use,” said Robbins. “Since a geothermal heat pump uses 1 unit of energy to transfer 3-4 units of “free” energy from the earth it is up to 400% efficient compared to a high-efficiency furnace which is only 95%”.
